Re: PROCUREMENT OF INSECTICIDE, RAINBOOTS AND PIN AXE

- 1. The *Government of Liberia* has received financing from the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) and intends to apply a part of the proceeds of the financing to this purchase. The use of any IFAD financing shall be subject to IFAD's approval, pursuant to the terms and conditions of the financing agreement, as well as IFAD's rules, policies and procedures. IFAD and its officials, agents and employees shall be held harmless from and against all suits, proceedings, claims, demands, losses and liability of any kind or nature brought by any party in connection with the *Tree Crops Extension Project-II TCEP II*.
- 2. TCEP-II includes an IFAD loan of US\$ 13 million and an Adaptation for Smallholder Agriculture Programme (ASAP) grant of US\$ 4.5 million. The project will work towards developing a viable and sustainable smallholder cocoa sub-sector in Liberia's main producing belt.
- 3. This invitation for bids (IFB) will appear in *Inprofile Daily* newspaper on *August* 30, 2022, on the Ministry of Agriculture website and the Executive Mansion website.
- 4. The purchaser now invites sealed bids from eligible entities (bidders) for the provision of **Insecticides, Rain boots and Pin axe, two** (2) **Lots** for IFAD, PIU, Ministry of Agriculture Annex PMU, within 28 days. More details on these goods and related services are provided in the schedule of requirements in this bidding document.
- 5. This IFB is open to all eligible bidders who wish to respond. Subject to restrictions noted in the bidding document, eligible entities may associate with other bidders to enhance their capacity to successfully carry out the procurement.
- 6. The goods and related services, and the contract expected to be awarded, are divided into the following lots:

Lot #1 – Insecticides

Lot #2 – Rain boots and Pin axe

7. Bidding will be conducted using the **national competitive bidding (NCB)** method, the evaluation procedure for which is described in this bidding document, in accordance with the IFAD Procurement Handbook which is provided at www.ifad.org/project-procurement. The

NCB process, as described, will include a review and verification of qualifications and past performance, including a reference check, prior to the contract award.

- 8. Please note that a pre-bid conference [will not] be held as described in the bid data sheet (BDS), Section III of the bidding document.

- 11. Bidders shall be aware that late bids will not be accepted under any circumstance and will be returned unopened at the written request and cost of the bidder. All bids must be accompanied by a bid security or bid-securing declaration (as required) in the manner and amount specified in the bid data sheet.
- 12. Please note that electronic bids *shall not* be accepted.
