The services to be carried out by the Gender and Social Specialist under the supervision of the Project Coordinator include: contributing to a program of analytical and operational work focused on integrating key gender, social accountability and inclusion issues into the STAR-P portfolio; generating write-ups of best practices in established and emerging areas of relevance for social development in agri-business operations; supporting the implementation of the World Bank agenda on social inclusion, citizen engagement and gender mainstreaming, including through direct operational support, briefs to senior management; contributing to strengthening partnerships within PMU projects, implementing partners, stakeholders and the agricultural sector in Liberia, in key areas of analytic and operational work; liaising with academic institutions and think tanks in disseminating and exchanging knowledge on good practices; and supporting knowledge management, capacity building and outreach efforts.

The Ministry of Agriculture now invites eligible individual consultants to indicate their interest in performing the Services. Interested Individual Consultants should provide updated Curriculum Vitae (CV) and relevant documents indicating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services.

The shortlisting criteria include Master's Degree in Management, Public Administration, economics and the social sciences with at least two years of directly relevant experience **OR** a Bachelor's degree in similar areas and five years relevant work experience in the public and private sector; familiarity with the literature and policy aspects related to social development, governance, and gender issues; strong written and spoken English language communications skills, among others.
